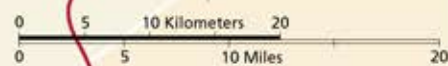
Trail of Tears National Historic Trail: The removal routes of the Choctaw, Chickasaw, Cherokee, Muscogee (Creek), and Seminole people from their homelands between 1830 and 1850 are collectively referred to as the "Trail of Tears." The historic routes stretch 5,043 miles across nine states.
